## <u>Input by the United Nations Alliance of Civilizations to the elements to be</u> <u>considered in the New Agenda for Peace</u>

There is a growing consensus that to build peaceful, cohesive and resilient communities/societies, it is essential to address <u>inequalities</u> including those driven by <u>cultural and identity based grievances</u> before they lead to conflict and violent extremism as and when conducive to terrorism. Addressing such inequalities in a meaningful way is also one of the key elements to forge a <u>new social contract</u> (OCA proposal # 53 ). To halt the proliferation of conflicts there is need to strengthen and <u>invest in prevention</u>. In this respect, <u>promoting interreligious and intercultural dialogue to defuse identity-based tensions</u> remain largely overlooked in terms of reshaping our response to violence and investing more in preventive tools (OCA proposal #43).
